Dear Members,

Oh my...On October 1st, it will be only 86 days till Christmas and 92 days till the New Year! Where has this year gone? I keep busy volunteering which helps keep my mind and body busy and exercised.

I volunteer here at the Riverside AARP Chapter, at least two days a week, three on the first week of the month! I also spend time on the internet researching and attending zoom meetings on AARP activities at the state and national level each week. I invite you to visit and take a tour with me or any of the volunteers there on Fridays, Saturdays & Sundays. If you have family or friends visit you, this is a great place to bring them. My grandson volunteers with me and we give fun "family" tours.
